About the Position:

The Azrieli School of Architecture & Urbanism at Carleton University invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track or tenured appointment at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, to begin in the fall of 2021.

This new position in Design and Spatial Justice requires applicants to demonstrate a trajectory of work that engages with ethical challenges embedded in design practice, research, and pedagogy. We are interested in candidates whose work crosses disciplinary boundaries and who employ creative and/or heterodox pedagogies and intellectual frameworks to address decolonial, non-Western, feminist, antiracist, and intersectional approaches to the built environment through their teaching, research, and creative practice.

The successful candidate will address ongoing challenges and lasting legacies of inequity - colonial, environmental, juridical, patrimonial, racial - in the built environment, and will expand discourse around systemic inequity in architecture and urbanism around these themes, or linked to other research that may include, for example, the following:

- Spatial forms of oppression and of resistance
- Historically marginalized communities
- Housing equity and urban policy
- Identity and representation in the built environment
- Environmental justice

The selected candidate will be expected to lead design studios, workshops and seminars at both the undergraduate and graduate level, to advise graduate students, and to participate actively in the intellectual, cultural and administrative life of the School.

About the Academic Unit:

The Azrieli School of Architecture & Urbanism is committed to the continuous effort to expand and strengthen our curriculum; to craft pedagogical structures and inclusive environments that are worthy of a diverse student body and Ottawa's many communities. Our unique building houses excellent studio, workshop, imaging and digital fabrication facilities. The School supports a number of research units - including the Carleton Immersive Media Studio ([CIMS](#)) and The Carleton Sensory Architectural and Liminal Technologies Lab ([CSALT](#)), the Carleton Urban Research Lab ([c-ur](#)), the [Carleton Climate Futures Design Lab](#) and a growing faculty with diverse research, teaching and scholarly interests.

Qualifications:

Qualified candidates must hold a terminal professional degree in Architecture, and have a demonstrated record of creative teaching. A strong research agenda, with or without a PhD, is also required, and can include community-based practice.

We are seeking candidates who demonstrate the following:

- Commitment to Spatial Justice
- Strong potential for innovative, interdisciplinary, and design research, and academic scholarship
- An emerging track record of high-quality research output through writing or published design work
- Excellence in design studio teaching
