# Master of Architecture **Application Instructions**

## M.ARCH PATHWAYS

We have two M.Arch pathways that you may apply to. The M.Arch admissions committee may recommend admission to either pathway based upon a holistic review of your application.

- M.Arch: Our advanced standing two-year course sequencing is intended for those holding a four-year, preprofessional undergraduate honours degree or its equivalent in architecture, with significant and specific studio experience in architectural design.
- M.Arch 1: Our three-year course sequencing is intended for individuals holding a four-year honours undergraduate degree from architecture or other diverse backgrounds who wish to pursue careers in architecture.

# **APPLICATION PROCESS**

Begin by creating a secure account at Carleton360 (https://360.carleton.ca), where you can select the specific program you wish to apply for.

## **DOCUMENT UPLOAD**

You will be required to upload specific documents.

For application to any of our graduate programs, you will need to upload the following to your application account:

- 1) a Statement of Intent,
- 2) a CV/Resumé,
- 3) a Writing Sample,
- 4) Transcripts,
- 5) Reference Contact Information,
- 6) if applicable, a Language Proficiency Evaluation, and
- 7) your SlideRoom portfolio upload receipt.

All documents, with the exception of your portfolio itself, are to be uploaded to your application account.

# PORTFOLIO UPLOAD

Your portfolio will be uploaded via a separate file service: SlideRoom (www.asoaau.slideroom.com). You will need to create an account and pay an associated fee to SlideRoom for this service. Once uploaded, you will receive a confirmation number from SlideRoom that your submission has been received. You must upload your SlideRoom receipt to your application account.

#### REQUIRED **DOCUMENTS**

### 1) Statement of Intent

Your Statement of Intent should express your interest in Architecture as a field of graduate study. It is a verbal pairing to your portfolio of visual work and should reflect your authentic voice. The suggested length of the Statement of Intent is 2 pages (maximum).

#### 2) C.V./Resume

## 3) Writing Sample

Submit one writing sample from previous coursework or publication (maximum of 5 pages). The writing sample gives evidence of your verbal skills and style and helps us to understand how you frame an inquiry, creative reflection or critical position in and through writing.

# 4) Transcripts

Please note that all post-secondary education transcripts are required. Electronic transcripts (preferred) will be accepted from Canadian and US institutions and considered official if sent directly from the institution's Registrar's Office or other verified records office. Electronic transcripts must be sent to graduate.studies@carleton.ca.

Physical copies of official transcript(s) (if required) must be mailed directly to Carleton from your home institution in a sealed university envelope from the office issuing the transcript(s). Official transcript(s) must indicate that your degree has been conferred. The mailing address is:

## 6) Language Proficiency (ESL Test Scores) - if applicable

# 7) Portfolio Upload Receipt

- The portfolio may contain up to **16 pages** of content, in either a single or two-page spread. The Admissions Committee reviews portfolios online; keep this in mind when preparing your portfolio layout. While the dimension of the portfolio is at the discretion of the applicant, we recommend between A4 A2 in size (8.5" x 11" 16.5" x 23"). Please note that the portfolio must be submitted online via SlideRoom and not uploaded with your other documents. **Physical portfolios will not be accepted**.
- You may include a title page and/or table of contents if you wish. These will not count toward the 16 pages. The digital portfolio should showcase recent, high-quality work, and will be judged on both its content and overall design. Please consider the scale and clarity of your selected images and texts when designing your portfolio and keep non-visual content to a minimum. While demonstrating mastery of a skill (drawing, modelling, rendering, building, etc) is beneficial, do keep in mind that we look for both your ability to think abstractly and conceptually, to ask questions and be reflective, as well as your ability to communicate visually with thoughtful and crafted drawings and models. Professional work can be selectively included but you must be clear about your role in the team/project.
- Applicants who do not possess formal training in architecture may include other creative works that evidence creativity (studio art, construction/renovation, etc.); this work should demonstrate abstract thinking and visual communication abilities.
- Any material that is not entirely the applicant's own work must be clearly identified.
- The portfolio must be submitted as a single PDF file (max. 10 Mb) via SlideRoom. (http://asoaau.slideroom.com).

Once you have submitted your complete application, you will be asked to pay a non-refundable application fee of \$100. Within 1-3 business days, you will receive instructions to access and log in to Carleton Central, our University student information portal.
