

Call for Applications: STUDIO FIRST Studio Assistant

Application Deadline: January 20, 2026

The STUDIO FIRST non-academic program invites applications for the position of Studio Assistant for the summer of 2026.

This call is limited to candidates **currently enrolled** at the Azrieli School of Architecture & Urbanism at Carleton University.

STUDIO FIRST 2026 will deliver two online sessions: May 12-June 16 and June 23- July 28.

The Studio Assistant is required to work during studio sessions, working directly with students on project development, offering feedback, and supporting the lead instructor as needed. Studio assistants need to be available for about 90 to 100 hours, including about 80 hours of class time over five weeks for one session, with additional meetings and support hours as needed.

The pay is \$3,067.00 per session.

Applicants may apply for one or both sessions, which will take place entirely on Zoom.

The Studio Assistant will:

- attend all in-studio sessions
- serve as a studio assistant to the project leads throughout the course
- engage in desk and project reviews and provide guidance, support, and feedback to students
- facilitate skills development across analogue and digital techniques
- report student progress to instructors
- participate in occasional planning and promotion activities for STUDIO FIRST
- attend all project reviews
- assist students outside of class time, on occasion and as needed, to help guide them in their work through Zoom meetings and/or providing written feedback on their posted work
- assist the Technical Coordinator with the portfolio workshops for each session and attend the workshops to help provide feedback
- assemble jpeg images of best work at the end of each of the three projects

This is a non-union position. Candidates will work closely with the STUDIO FIRST Academic Coordinator, the Special Programs Officer, and the teaching team.
