<b>Course Title</b>	Architectural Discourse II

<b>Course Description</b>	Survey of cultural theories from the beginning of colonialism to this day. Considerations of how technological, socio-political, material, and ecological transformations inform architectural discourse. Students acquire research skills, considering topics such as race, gender, disability, environmental justice, Indigenous worldviews, climate, decolonisation, or artificial intelligence.

<b>Anticipated Modality</b>	In-person
<b>Anticipated Course Enrolment</b>	75-90 students
<b>Anticipated TA Support</b>	1 TA @ 130 hours
<b>Required qualifications</b>	All candidates must have a professional degree in Architecture, though consideration may be given to candidates with a degree in Architecture History and Theory or other related design and planning fields. Preference will be given to candidates with teaching experience or a Ph.D. in the subject area. Evidence of ongoing training and engagement with equity, diversity, and inclusive approaches to teaching and pedagogy is an asset. Expertise in areas listed in the calendar description is required.
